2. What qualities do you consider necessary for an effective Trustee, and how do you demonstrate those qualities?



In addition to filling out the "Application for Appointment to Berkeley Boards and Commissions", candidates are requested to provide additional information to assist the Board of Library Trustees in their process to recommend names to the City Council.

1. Describe your interest in serving as a Library Trustee.

As I enter retirement I want to turn the energy that I've put into the national (and international) library world into my own local library. I've been attending BOLT meetings for most of the past 6 months, and feel that there's a lot that I can contribute. And this is a good time, with a new Library Director on board. I think that my very strong library background can help me offer her advice on both library-world issues, and on the feelings of the Berkeley community.

- 2. What qualities do you consider necessary for an effective Trustee, and how do you demonstrate those qualities?
  - 1) Knowledge of community values. (I've lived in Berkeley since 1970, and owned a home here since 1984. Get regular mailings from 3 City Council members. Read BerkeleySide every day [and invested in it]. Regularly visit Farmers Markets.)
  - 2) Ability to apply those community values to the library setting. (I have always brought the values of my communities [such as equity/diversity/inclusion] into my work and professional activities)
    3) Fiscal and administrative responsibility. (I headed an academic program for a dozen years, and have run several multi-million dollar library or archiving projects.)
- 3. Provide examples of current or previous community service and leadership roles.

Co-creator of Library Freedom Institute, training 100 public librarians to become Digital Privacy Advocates, and to work with privacy-fragile community groups (LGBT teens, immigrants, seniors) to protect privacy from both governmental agencies and commercial predators. This is just the latest in over a dozen grant-funded projects that I have envisioned and led (many highly complex and funded for millions of dollars). [The largest of these was Preserving Born-Digital Public Television, which has since morphed into the American Archive of Public Television, housed in the Library of Congress.] I am also a community activist who has been involved in many local struggles over the years (BTU, Critical Mass, UCB Divestment, Homeless Direct Action Committee etc.)

4. What do you see as the Library's role in the community now and in the future?

At the heart of the Library's mission is serving the underserved. Libraries fill the gap where other governmental agencies fail (latch-key kids, daytime sheltering for the unhoused). Libraries are also guardians of social values even outside the library (equal access to information, diversity of information resources, anti-censorship, privacy). This is why libraries get involved in lobbying for funding technology (bandwidth, computers) to poorer segments of the community. Berkeley PL should lend moral support to threats to library values even when these occur outside the library setting (like when Cody's was fire-bombed). For example, during COVID crisis, BPL should be lending morale support to the Internet Archive's Controlled Digital Lending—particularly the offering of tens of thousands of children's books online

#### **Qualifications:**

Have owned and operated a small family run business here in Berkeley for a number of years.

#### Reason for my interest:

In 2019 I was accepted into the MLIS (Masters of Library and Information Sciences) program at San Jose State University but decided to defer my studies for a year until my youngest child was in Kindergarten. The deferment has unfortunately continued longer than intended due to Covid.

When my kids were very small the storytime hour was something I looked forward to every week, having that space for human interaction with other moms was crucial for me and I know it is for others as well. It would be my pleasure to help the library in any way I can, especially after we come out of this yearlong lockdown.
- 2. What qualities do you consider necessary for an effective Trustee, and how do you demonstrate those qualities? An effective Trustee would have empathy to readers needs and the community. They should have the understanding that a passion for books is not shared by everyone but to increase the appeal and accessibility to books/libraries to all groups even if they don't have that passion. Also a library is not just about books. A Trustee, I believe, needs to understand the role the structure plays within the community as a safe space and meeting place for human connection as well as education. I not only love books but our community and all those within and around it.
- 3. Provide examples of current or previous community service and leadership roles. I served on the board for my youngest child's preschool in 2019/2020. I served in the Treasurer/Accounts Receivable role. Currently I am volunteering at my children's school to help with Covid Testing for the students. I am also volunteering at the Friends of the Library bookstore. Prior to the COVID pandemic I ran a family charter boat business from Berkeley Marina, my husband served as Captain while I ran the back office and customer service.
- 4. What do you see as the Library's role in the community now and in the future? The library is a place of safety, comfort, education, entertainment and community. A library should not only be a free service where the community can access books/DVDs/magazines and other media platforms but also a comfortable safe place to gather as a community, whether that be for storytime hour with small children or getting help on your taxes. The physical library itself can be a space to stay cool in the summer and warm in the winter for those who may be otherwise left to the elements. When the library closed down in 2020 it suddenly became clear to me how important the library is to so many people and as we come out of Pandemic Mode here in 2021 I hope to see all the libraries reopen their doors and all the past programs the library offered be once again available in person.

1. Describe your interest in serving as a Library Trustee.

Libraries are one of the most important, yet vulnerable assets, in any community. I believe having informed advocates on the Board of Library Trustees is critical at this juncture in our City's history. As a recently retired Director of Library and Recreation Services, I understand firsthand the challenges facing our libraries and would love the opportunity to share my insight and experience. My 35-year career in municipal government has provided me a sound foundation to serve the residents of Berkeley as a member of the Board of Library Trustees. It is my turn to give back to the community.

2. What qualities do you consider necessary for an effective Trustee, and how do you demonstrate those qualities?

The ability to communicate clearly, coupled with a willingness to listen empathetically, is essential for anyone hoping to effectively serve as a member of the Board of Library Trustees. Listening to the viewpoints of others in a courteous, respectful manner, whether you agree or not, will facilitate meaningful dialogue. I believe I am an analytical thinker and have developed listening skills that allow me to convey my thoughts to others without feeling the need to be dismissive or condescending when discussing issues with colleagues who have diverging opinions.

3. Provide examples of current or previous community service and leadership roles.

Prior to my retirement, most of my community service activity was directly related to my children. I served as a member of the Principal's Advisory Board at St. Thomas More School in San Francisco for many years. Libraries play a critical role in helping bridge the digital divide. The pandemic exposed the widening gap between the haves and the have nots, as schools transitioned to distance learning. Many families did not have the resources to engage in distance learning. Schools and libraries have helped provide the tools necessary for students to succeed. I firmly believe libraries will continue to play a role in not just providing books, but also providing technological support to families in need.

1. Describe your interest in serving as a Library Trustee.

The library has been an important part of my life for as long as I can remember. From receiving my first library card at the age of five to discovering the the music room of our local library where I listened to opera when I was a pre-teen I often found refuge in the library. As a workstudy college student I shelved books in the library when I wasn't in the stacks doing my research and relied on the foreign press and magazines in the Periodical Room to improve my language skills. Little did I know that during grad school I would support myself during the summers by serving as a library assistant at the Boulder Public Library, so for many yearsI have been surrounded by books and people who value what they bring to our lives.

In the early 1980s I was privileged to be the City Council representative to the Library Board and served with Regina Minudri, a beloved Director. Although a library patron, I was not well versed regarding the inner workings of the library, I learned quickly. What became clear to me was the commitment and involvement of the director and staff in the efficient running of the library and in necessary adjustments and changes. That was a time of relative calm at the library.

I have relied on the library as a source of reading material and in many conversations with my mother I can recall her talking about the happenings at her library. She was a regular patron, well-known by the staff for inviting a representative to address her senior organization every year—and she was a reliable worker at their book sales. When her eyesight began to fail, they introduced her to large print books and during my visits I often searched the shelves for mysteries she had not yet read; rarely were there many. Sadly, she had great difficulty slowly adjusting to life without books.

Now in 2021 the Library is moving away from recent upheavals and appears to be on a clear course to a healthy involvement of staff and community in its operations and future. I have useful organization skills and am a reliable colleague and collaborator, all of which I believe will be helpful to the Board as members continue to deliberate on the future of the library. I would very much like to be one representative of our community working with the library director and Board to maintain a steady course which continues to respect all parties and find ways to maintain positive relationships and outcomes in most, if not all, situations.

2. What qualities do you consider necessary for an effective Trustee, and how do you demonstrate those qualities?

As a member of every organization in which I serve, I commit myself most importantly to being an attentive listener and to respecting my colleagues regardless of their opinions while always maintaining discretion with what I know and what I say. I value attending meetings as fully prepared as possible and having done my homework. In my organizational work I have never shirked from committee work, considering it a requirement of membership. As an example, during a lengthy hospitalization several years ago, I prepared agendas and chaired a nomination committee from my hospital bed. Colleagues often joke with me because they know that at meetings I often mention the words "assumptions" and "expectations" in order to clarify thinking, and although they smile, they find that aspect of my style to be helpful. It has served me well on many occasions. If I pass the scrutiny of appointers, I would consider my service to the library as an honor and a commitment which requires the very best of my energy, thoughts, and time.

3. Provide examples of current or previous community service and leadership roles.

I served on the Berkeley Zoning Board and Planning Commission and chaired those bodies for a period of time. I was elected and re-elected to the City Council and served four years as Vice-Mayor. I've volunteered in school classrooms, most importantly reading to and assisting children and helping older students with their writing skills; on several occasions I was invited as a guest speaker at Berkeley High. During the 1990s I worked with Namaste, a bereavement counseling organization, relying on my

social work training and my personal experiences. Since training as a UC Master Gardener In 2006, I have maintained active membership and just completed five years as President. During that time we reorganized our structure, wrote new By-laws and an Operations Manual, and increased our membership. I am a life-long musician, a singer, and have been a member of Berkeley Community Chorus and Orchestra since 1999. Together with 16 colleagues I currently serve on the Board of Directors and chairi our Grants and Registration Committees. I am a member of the Friends of the Library, have worked at the book sales, and have enjoyed attending their meetings.

4. What do you see as the Library's role in the community now and in the future?

Although books remain the main focus, the library is more than books. For many the library is a safe place away from the distractions of life, a place of welcome regardless of one's station in life and often a refuge from the pain and deprivation afflicting too many in our community. It is also the "go to" place for the truth, access to intellectual freedom, where fiction is actually fiction and fact is fact. It is also the gateway for information which lies beyond the local library but is linked to libraries near and far. The library is also librarians, so many of whom live in our city and are long-time employees with a deep commitment to the functioning of the library. They are professionals who greet patrons warmly, people who have befriended library patrons and in some instances have inspired and opened worlds of wonder and knowledge to younger patrons, people who so often go out of their way "to find the information" and are deeply. committed to being of public service. I consider them the heart and soul of he library, from the most junior employee to the Director.

During this past year so many who have relied on the library have suffered by not having the library as a source of community. Children coming to story-time, pupils/students attending homework groups and tutoring, job-seekers using resources to find employment, immigrants learning English, residents working on literacy and improving their language skills, those without Internet access who bring their computers and those who use the library's computers, people who felt the loss of meeting rooms, those without homes who want quiet and respite, and the

many who depend on the Tool Lending Library—all of them must be celebrating the gradual re-opening.

The library must continue to offer the variety of services it already offers and strive to respond when possible to new requests as they arise. A primary focus must remain finding ways to reach more residents from neighborhoods of the city where the patronage is lower than in other areas. Events at the library and finding ways to increase their number and diversifying their subject matter may be a consideration. The need for community space will undoubtedly increase, technology will improve and change and we will need to expand digital materials; we will undoubtedly be relying more on the Inter-library Loan System, perhaps improving it. In speaking with teachers and relying on my own experience with my students, I have discovered that although the Internet offers a wealth of Information, students often do not know how to evaluate what it offers. In the future it may be helpful to increase connections with high schools, to actually bring students into the library and teach them how to assess such information in a way that leads to further investigation and ways to judge the reliability of information. An increased immigrant population will need English language learning classes and I can foresee language sessions at the library. I can even envision conversation groups at the library, people learning one language while sharing their language with their partner. Such is the situation a close friend experienced at the main library in Bologna. Additionally, as our population ages, we should expect a greater demand from seniors, many of whom are avid readers. This development may call for a permanent delivery service for those patrons. Those changes and more which have yet to arise will look to the library as a primary resource.

The free public library system and free public education are institutions which have endured political struggles and changes over the years. These past few years when we are finally beginning to reckon with our history and to find ways to live up to our national ideals, the library is one place where we witness and experience the diversity of our community and can demonstrate respect for and the value of everyone. Maintaining these strengths is essential in any changes at the library. Our Berkeley Public Library, one of the two best libraries in California, has proven that it can adapt and there is reason to believe that that will not change. I would be honored to be included in serving our community on the Board.

My training as a lawyer has prepared me to be a strong communicator, with people from all different backgrounds.

  - I was on the Board of Directors for the YEAH! Shelter from 2013 to 2017, when it was merged with Covenant House. I served as a board member, co-chair, and secretary during my time on the Board. I have served on the Emerson Elementary PTA board as an Equity Liaison. I have taken advantage of both the Equity Circle at Emerson Elementary, and the Racial Justice Activation Circle through Berkeley School Volunteers last summer. I volunteered at Emerson Elementary, both in classrooms and the library, during the entire 8 years my children attended. My position as Deputy Director at Homeless Action Center involves leadership not only in the organization, but also in the homeless-services community.
- 4. What do you see as the Library's role in the community now and in the future?

  The library is a source of information, access, and adventure for all. In the future, I think the library will continue to connect people to information. The library will grow it's digital holdings, but I think will maintain a physical presence. Recent trends have seen libraries being built as " destinations." I think this will continue. I also think that libraries will develop ways to connect people to more social and community services. Aside from just having information, they may actually have services available in the form of case managers or social workers.

1 - Describe your interest in serving as a Library Trustee.

APPLICATION OF MARJORIE HAMMER. When I came across the post of an opening for a Berkeley Public Library trustee, I was immediately intrigued as percolating on my back burner has been a desire to serve in a multi-year role on a public commission and also because I've been thinking for awhile (and particularly during this pandemic year) of ways the Berkeley libraries are needed and could improve and expand. I have been a Berkeley resident and avid user of the Berkeley Public Library since 1985. I am very familiar with the Central library as well as Claremont; South, West, North Berkeley, and the tool lending libraries. Having raised children and now grandchildren in Berkeley; being a long-time member of several book groups, a nurse, and now a professor of pediatrics and mental health nursing; having a family member and a number of very close friends who are librarians; and being an active participant in the East Bay community, I have a life-long interest in books, learning, and the role of libraries and learning in the creation and sustenance of dynamic communities with meaningful commitments to equity, inclusion, and community and individual physical and mental health. In my work as a nurse, nurse practitioner, and professor, I have for 30 years dedicated my work life to serving vulnerable populations and to developing future nurses and the nursing profession to a deepening commitment and activism related to community service, public health, and social justice. I myself have been in the position of single mother of biracial children; on government aid and user of subsidized childcare; through community college to state college to university; and finally a professional and grandmother in a large close-knit family of individuals of Eastern European, Sephardic, Central American, and African-American descent. These identities inform who I am as a person and my volunteer and professional work. I believe that libraries can serve as centers of health, wellness, community, vision, and hope. Libraries can bring people together for higher purposes as well as address day-to-day questions and needs. People of all ages think favorably of libraries. I am someone who enjoys being active in the community in which I live, observing the world around me, noticing what needs improvement, generating ideas for change, and then acting on those ideas. I have years of experience working collaboratively as a team member, motivating others to see new visions but also face current realities, and getting things done. I believe that my life and work demonstrate why I would be a good match for the role of Berkeley Public Library Trustee.

2- What qualities do you consider necessary for an effective Trustee, and how do you represent these qualities?

I believe an effective Trustee should be an individual who is representative of the community; has community connections; enjoys people, reading, learning, and using technology to bring books and learning to life; is committed to respecting and serving all people, regardless of race, ethnicity, religion, age, gender identity, economic status, and physical or mental health; likes to explore new ideas and situations, and get to know new people and organizations; has explored their ability to be courageous, humble, a good listener, a team member, and a leader; is articulate orally and in writing; can analyze situations and budgets creatively, ethically, and reasonably, within the framework of what is possible; and is both practical and visionary. A good sense of humor seems important, given the potential stressors involved. Being bi- or tri-lingual would help. I believe that all of the above are true about me, with the exception of being fluent in multiple languages [my primary language is English; I can

read and understand quite a bit of Spanish (but have a harder time coming up with words on my own!)]. As a nurse, I am required to understand and work within my scope of practice as defined by the California Board of Registered Nursing, administer chemotherapy and other medications within established protocols, operate within a defined and sometimes unspoken hierarchy of healthcare professionals, and follow policy and procedures of the institution where I work. I have to work well on a team, demonstrate leadership, follow through with commitments, and be articulate. To be skillful, I need to be open to all the quirks of what it means to be human (including my own humanity) and be flexible to competing and surprising needs that can emerge without warning. A part of my work is to serve on committees, such as the Policy & Procedure Committee, Quality Improvement, and Diversity Equity and Inclusion. See question 1 & 3 for further examples of how I demonstrate these qualities.

3-Provide examples of current or previous community service and leadership roles.

At UCSF Benioff Oakland Children's Hospital, where I was employed for 20 years, the focus of my work was with children with cancer, sickle cell anemia, and HIV/AIDS and their families. I provided presentations in the community about this work and published articles. At Samuel Merritt University, where I have been employed for 12 years, I founded and direct the SMU Annual Community Reads initiative, now in its 8th year, where we choose a book related to healthcare and social justice to read together and explore themes each year [we have hosted authors related to topics ranging from farmworkers health (Fresh Fruit Broken Bodies by Seth Holmes: Delores Huerta); adverse childhood experiences (The Deepest Well: California Surgeon General Nadine Burke Harris); gender fluency (The 57 Bus; Dashka Slater); genetic therapies and the exploitation of bodies/people of color (The Immortal Cells of Henrietta Lacks; we hosted the Lacks' children as speakers); and more]. Academic year 2021-22 we will be hosting Riva Lehrer, author of Golem Girl, about living with disability, social justice issues related to disability, and the influence of the disability rights movement. I also founded and am director of The Spirit Seminars, a series of easily replicable seminars for nursing students (including reading the book, The Spirit Catches You, You Fall Down) that invite the student to engage in self exploration and learning related to their life experiences, experiences in clinical settings, inequities in care provision, and their role as future leaders in development and provision of patient-centered, culturally sensitive care. I have also served on the SMU Diversity Equity and Inclusion task force since its inception, the Policy & Procedure Committee, Quality Improvement Task Force, as well as do work in the community with a number of East Bay organizations which address needs of underserved populations. (See resume for presentations and publications.)

4-What do you see as the library's role now and in the future?

See above re Library's role now in the community. Re the future: I have several ideas I've been thinking about over the years about ways the Berkeley Public Library could improve and/or change, including: - having one or more community reads initiative that include books that appeal to a range of participants, e.g., teens, elders, social justice focused, health focused, mystery fans, AAPI, etc; -partnering with and serving local public and private schools, churches and temples, and community organizations at their sites and inviting them into the libraries; - partnering with local places that provide unique and/or higher education (Berkeley Community College, UCBerkeley, Jazz School, Freight & Salvage, Berkeley Rep, etc) and museums (Berkeley Art, Berkeley Historic Society, Magnes Museum, etc); -more activities for preschool age, school-age, teens, and elders; - supporting alternatives to books, e.g., poetry slams, local film-makers and playwrights; -more partnerships with local musicians and artists; -improving the

offerings of the current catalog by having more up-to-date books and books by authors not historically represented (POC, gender diverse, self-published, etc); - having a more robust online catalog and more robust technology services in the library; and - addressing public health (physical and mental health) needs through library service. In addition, I believe the nation's libraries, including Berkeley Public Libraries (and other Bay Area libraries), need to explore their role related to serving homeless, housing insecure, and those with limited wifi and technology knowledge/ access. These individuals and groups do now use libraries for respite and are often seen as "problems" or "challenges". Given that this is what is, is there a way to change the lens through which this is viewed and to more creatively address the needs that "show up" inside community libraries? It seems an inclusive community/system-wide, coordinated response is required - yet not yet imagined.

Trustees oversee everything from allocation of resources to implementation of programs. In between we have a duty to ensure that Berkeley continues to provide the most diverse and relevant collection that we can. A genuine sense of Civic Pride, creative thinking and interest in a wide range of topics will allow me to lend a socially minded and artistic eye to my duties.

If we are going to imagine, design and build a social structure, we must also maintain it. That is a

- 1. Describe your interest in serving as a Library Trustee.

  Growing up, the library was a refuge for me. I loved books (and the library was the place to get books,) but I also loved the Saturday silent film club and the craft program that taught me to tie-dye. As a young journalist in Baltimore, I was privileged to cover one of the great library systems in this country, the Enoch Pratt Free Library. When budget cuts forced the Pratt leadership to reduce hours and even close branches, the whole community suffered. In my lifetime, public libraries have changed greatly, but their mission remains central to the health of the community. I am eager to ensure that libraries thrive for future generations.
- 2. What qualities do you consider necessary for an effective Trustee, and how do you demonstrate those qualities?

An effective library trustee must listen to the public and understand their needs and values; be a diligent steward of library resources; support the library leadership and staff as they serve their vital public roles; and represent the library within and outside the community so that others see its intrinsic value.

I am already an advocate for the Berkeley library, and I would expand my efforts in a more formal role. I am experienced in engaging the public and promoting education. In my professional life I handle budgets, manage a team, and plan and meet ambitious goals.

Inextricably, the library should be the heart of the community. This is something I believe can hold up under even the variability of the future. In 2019, no one could have guessed what 2020 would bring, yet libraries still persevere to support their communities in safe ways. The Library needs to be fluid enough to fit the ever changing needs of Berkeley, whatever the future may bring.
