1. Describe your interest in serving as a Library Trustee.


I got my first Berkeley Public Library card in 1985. As an eight year old, I carefully printed my long, hyphenated name on the yellow paper card under the watchful eye of Carol the children's librarian at the Claremont branch. In high school, the Main Branch librarians at the reference desk showed me how to use microfiche and where to find books deep in the stacks. With my own two kids, we waited eagerly for the remodeling of the West Branch and spent hours in picture book and young readers section. During the pandemic I loaded my kindle with library e-books and stood in line at the North Branch to pick up books for the whole family. I have reaped the benefit of the Berkeley Public Libraries for my entire life – serving as a Library Trustee is an opportunity to share my perspective as a long time user of the system and to ensure the continuation and expansion of all the libraries can offer to enrich our city.

In addition to the centrality of the library to my personal life, I have worked for over 20 years in education; specifically in the field of adolescent literacy. I began teaching middle school students in Oakland in the early 2000s and currently work as the Director of Professional Learning for Reading Apprenticeship at WestEd. In this capacity I design and deliver professional learning to 6th-12th grade teachers as well as college instructors focused on disciplinary literacy. We strive to make the invisible process of reading visible to all learners. We specifically work with teachers to support young people in the development of their own "Reader Identity". I believe that libraries are key partners with families, schools, and communities to increase overall literacy in our communities. They are uniquely positioned to provide both physical and digital spaces that are inclusive of all ages, races, genders and other identities. As a trustee, I want to build on the strengths of the library system while reimagining how the library can continue to grow and evolve. During my life, I have seen all of the branches of the Berkeley Public Library physically remodeled — in the next phase I hope to see other transformations that keep the libraries relevant, accessible and representative of our Berkeley community.

2. What qualities do you consider necessary for an effective Trustee, and how do you demonstrate those qualities?

I work with math teachers to increase students' success. With those teachers and students we introduce the concept of "productive persistence" which we define as tenacity plus good strategies. Tenacity is a sense of "stick-with-it-ness" and strategies help students be effective and efficient. Productive persistence is also a necessary quality for a Trustee. A Trustee must be committed and passionate as well as bring the skills necessary for formulating policy and managing library funds.

I am a committed library patron - a user who experiences many services from kids and YA books, digital and adult collections, to the tool library and new kitchen items. I also bring my professional skills from managing multi-million dollar federals grants funds, and



facilitating adult learning. In my current role at WestEd I work with county, district and school leaders to improve secondary literacy instruction. Through grants and fee for service contracts, I strategize with leaders to create learning opportunities aligned with student achievement goals. This requires not only managing and delivering high quality professional learning but understanding competing initiatives and mandates as well as negotiating complex relationships with multiple stakeholders. I enjoy the challenge of learning about each of our partners and finding innovative ways to meet the needs of teachers and students. I strive to center racial and social justice through literacy. This requires a commitment to rethinking and restructuring systems and institutions. Currently, I work daily to place equity at the forefront and would be honored to bring my equity lens, my learning stance, and my commitment to racial and social justice to Trustees and community partners as we collaborate to sustain and grow the Berkeley Public Libraries.

3. Provide examples of current or previous community service and leadership roles.

Much of my recent community service is connected to Berkeley Unified School District. I served for four years on the Rosa Parks School School Site Council and served as co-chair for two years with Paco Furlan. During that time I worked with Laura Babitt to reform and revise the election process to be more inclusive and representative of our school population. I have also been team manager for my children's sports team. Professionally, I am involved in the development and functioning of two employee resources groups: Allies and co-conspirators as well as Women in Tech.

4. What do you see as the Library's role in the community now and in the future?

On September 9th, 2020 the sky turned red and the Bay Area was blanketed with smoke. The darkness amplified the world around me – my beloved California was burning, we were in the midst of a worldwide pandemic, new instances of violence against black people continued, and income inequality skyrocketed. Now more than ever, it is imperative that individuals, organizations and institutions have the courage to act, to be innovative and bold, to end a culture of white supremacy, and to truly explore and work towards an equitable Bay Area. I believe that highly collaborative, equity centered work requires true partnership that can only be achieved through community engagement. I have dedicated my career to improving educational equity, innovation and quality learning experiences. Though crucially important, working only with schools is not enough. We must work side by side, across institutions, organizations, and public private collaborations. We must holistically engage and connect, to shift the power to communities that will make the Bay Area thrive. In Berkeley, the libraries are already rethinking, redesigning and recreating programming in both physical and digital spaces. I believe libraries are dynamic organisms - not static entities and I'm excited to be a part of the ongoing evolution.
