## **The Landry News** by Andrew Clements

## **Discussion:**

- Should the principal of a school have the power to censor articles in a school newspaper?
- Why does the Constitution guarantee freedom of speech - that is, say that the government should not be able to decide what is and isn't allowed to be printed in a newspaper?
- Should people able to publish lies, mean, or hateful things about others on the Internet or anywhere else?
- Do you know anyone who is a journalist? What do you know about journalism?
- Why would anyone choose to pay for a newspaper when you can get news for free nowadays?
- Which would you rather have, truth without mercy or lies with kindness?
- Would your parents get upset if you wrote an essay or story about them and published it?
- What rights do you have or do you think you should have to keep your information private?
